1	1926.50(c)	Does program specify person(s) responsible for training and rendering First Aid?	A person(s) who has a valid certificate in first aid training, the American Red Cross or equivalent shall be available at work sites to render emergency first aid.
2	1926.50(b)	Does the employer have a written program regarding First Aid?	Provisions shall be made prior to commencement of a project for prompt medical attention in case of serious injury.
3	1926.50(d)(1)	Does program address availability of first aid supplies?	First aid supplies shall be easily accessible when required.
4	1926.50(d)(2)	Does program specify a list of required items and how they are to be stored?	First aid kits shall consist of appropriate items and stored in a weather proof container with individual sealed packages of each type of item per ANSI Standard Z308.1-1998 or Appendix A of CFR 1910.151 (Aug 98) (minimum requirements). NOTE: A listing of First Aid items must be included in your program.
5	1926.50(d)(2)	Does program specify position responsible for the accessibility, checking contents & how often contents are to be checked?	The contents of the first aid kits shall be checked before being sent out to each job & at least weekly on each job to ensure that the expended items are replaced.
6	1926.50(e)	Does program specify procedures in getting injured persons to a physician or hospital?	Proper equipment for prompt transportation of the injured person to a physician or hospital or a communication system for contacting necessary ambulance service shall be provided.
7	1926.50(f)	Does program specify position responsible for posting emergency phone numbers at job site?	The telephone numbers of the physicians, hospitals or ambulances shall be conspicuously posted.
8	1926.50(g)	Does program specify procedures for quick drenching or flushing of eyes or body?	Where the eyes or body of any person may be exposed to injurious corrosive materials, suitable facilities shall be provided within the work area.
