Global Health locations in Texas City, Pasadena, and Baytown are open to the public for walk-in COVID-19 Antigen Quick Testing.

- Real-time infection status
- Laboratory machine in clinic
- Same-day results
- High accuracy
  - If the result shows positive, it is 100% accurate (predictive value)
  - Sensitivity 87.5%, Specificity 90%

Other testing methods available:

- Antibody finger stick testing (15 minutes)
- Blood draw antibody testing (average 5 days)
- PCR nasal swab testing (average 7 days)
- On-site testing
